Adults Protecting Children is a 501(c)3 that gives parents and youth serving organizations the tools and courage they need to prevent the sexual abuse of children. Adults Protecting Children is working in North Georgia to bring about in each county a prevention initiative to help eliminate child sexual abuse. In addition, Adults Protecting Children provide the training program Stewards of Children by Darkness to Light to various groups and organizations.

WHAT IS STEWARDS OF CHILDREN? Using the 5 Steps to Protecting Our Children[™] as a framework, Stewards of Children[®] is a two-hour training that teaches adults practical actions to prevent child sexual abuse or intervene if abuse is suspected. Featuring compelling and engaging content to motivate participants, the program is designed for parents, concerned individuals, and any adult that works with youth. Through Stewards of Children[®], over 1,000,000 adults have been trained to protect children from sexual abuse. It is available in both English and Spanish, and in online or facilitator-led formats.

Stewards of Children features survivors who lived through child sexual abuse, experienced its immediate and longterm effects, and ultimately were able to find healing. It also highlights experts who work with children and families and confront abuse on a daily basis. Research suggests that child sexual abuse reports, substantiations, and interventions in cases of abuse increase as a result of training, implying that more children are being identified as victims and able to receive services.

Perpetrators of domestic violence often hurt family pets to control and intimidate their victims. Ahimsa House, Inc. - a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose name means "nonviolence" - is dedicated to helping the human and animal victims of domestic violence across Georgia reach safety together.

Our Direct Services Program

- A 24-hour statewide crisis line Emergency shelter for animals of any kind while their owners reach safety from domestic violence
- Veterinary care for pets with injuries and other health conditions due to the abuse, as well as preventive veterinary care and spay/neuter Forensic veterinary examinations to document abuse and assist in prosecuting abusers
- Assistance in transporting pets to accompany their owners to safety (both within GA and across the country)
- Pet food, pet supplies, payment of pet deposits in transitional housing, and other assistance victims may need Crates and other pet supplies for domestic violence shelters, including shelters that have their own on-site housing for pets
- Assistance in including pets in safety planning
- Legal advocacy to assist victims in listing their pets on temporary protective orders.

Outreach Services Program

- Training and cross-training for a wide range of human services and animal protection agencies
- Direct outreach to the public to raise awareness about this issue, including speaking at meetings of civic organizations, setting up information booths at community festivals and workplace health fairs, and placing information brochures and posters in veterinary clinics and other strategic locations across the state
- Consultation to prosecutors on cases involving co-occurring animal cruelty and domestic violence, including expert witness services
- A <u>directory</u> of programs of this type elsewhere
- Participating in interdisciplinary conferences and meetings, such as Domestic Violence Task Forces, to keep the issue of animal abuse in domestic violence "at the table"

Al-Anon is a mutual support program for people who are living with - or have lived with - someone whose drinking created problems for themselves or others. Al-Anon recognizes that alcoholism is a family disease. The disease affects all those who have a relationship with a problem drinker. Alcoholism may emotionally, spiritually, and often physically affect loved ones in addition to the drinker. Al-Anon and Alateen's primary purpose is to help friends and families of alcoholics. However, many of our members first came because a friend or relative had a drug problem. Most eventually came to realize that someone else's drinking had also negatively affected their lives.

Alateen meetings are for young people, usually teenagers, whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. While Alateen members run their own meetings, adult Group Sponsors are there for safety and to provide guidance. To ensure the safety of Alateen meeting, Group Sponsors must be in compliance with Alateen Safety and Behavioral Requirements. Alateen helps young people understand how alcoholism affects the lives of all who are associated with a problem drinker and helps them find effective ways to deal with their personal problems. The nearest Alateen meeting is currently located in Cumming. Al-Anon meetings welcome and encourage teens to participate in their meetings. Where there are no Alateen groups, teens are encouraged to participate in Al-Anon meetings. Teens between the ages of 13-18 are also welcome to participate in Alateen Chat Meetings and can register at https://al-anon.org/newcomers/teen-corner-alateen/try-an-alateen-chat-meeting/

• There are no dues or fees. Members make voluntary contributions because each group isself-supporting.

• No appointments are necessary. Anyone concerned about someone else's drinking is welcome to walk in and attend.

• Anonymity is protected. The identity of all Al-Anon and Alateen members, as well as members of Alcoholics Anonymous, is protected.

• Al-Anon is a separate fellowship from Alcoholics Anonymous.

Due to current public health initiatives, we urge anyone seeking a meeting to connect with <u>a</u> <u>local Al-Anon Information Service office</u> to verify the current status before attending.

Avita Community Partners is a community agency that helps individuals and families affected by mental illness, developmental disabilities, and addictive diseases. There is a fee for some of Avita's services. Peachcare and Medicaid, Medicaid CMOs are accepted.

Services Offered:

Child and Adolescent Services

- Mental Health Services Avita offers a variety of outpatient treatment services for youth and their families. Licensed staff members work with children and adolescents to enhance their mental, emotional, and social functioning by giving them the tools they need to succeed.
- Substance Abuse Services It is vital to reach youth who are facing addictive diseases early. Our adolescent substance abuse treatment program provides assessment and treatment for addiction at community facilities that are close to home.
- Crisis Prevention And Intervention services are available to prevent crisis through rapid response to critical situations. Our trained staff provides supportive counseling, consultation, and identification of resources and referrals.
- Medical Depending on treatment needs, medical services may be available including physician and nursing care, medication management, and pharmacy services.

Adult Behavioral Health Programs

- **Psychoeducational Classes and Counseling** Avita offers short-term individual, family, and group educational and counseling services to help you and your family acquire knowledge and self-help skills for coping, problem solving, and recovery. Group sessions and classes are available that teach topics such as living skills, medication management, anger and stress management, anxiety and phobia symptoms management, self-esteem boosters, parenting skills, and depression recovery techniques.
- **Rehabilitation and Community Support** If you have a serious mental illness, Rehabilitation and Community Support Services are available to help you manage your illness, improve your quality of life, and be as independent as possible. Avita personnel and Peer Support Specialists offer help managing daily activities such as coordinating medical care, food planning, budgeting skills, and more. Assistance with fulfilling vocational or employment goals is also available.
- Employment Support The Avita Employment Specialists can help individuals facing mental illness identify strengths, learn job skills, pursue interviews, and support them in succeeding at their job. Employment may only be a few hours per week up to full time employment. Our staff works with a variety of employers including banks, hospitals, food service operations, retail sites, manufacturing companies, and more.
- Medical Depending on treatment needs, medical services may be available including physician and nursing care, medication management, and pharmacy services.

Intellectual and Developmental Disability Services

- **Personal and Social Services** Individuals with Intellectual and developmental disabilities who live in their own residences may receive personal, social, and community support related to self-care and household maintenance. Avita personnel are available to assist with shopping, paying bills, participation in community activities, and other personal issues. Twenty-four hour support is available for those living with a host family.
- **Host/Respite** Some adults with Intellectual and development disabilities, who may have no nearby support of family to live with, find a place to call home thanks to the Avita Host Program. Avita trains, screens, and contracts with families who treat our clients with love, respect, dignity while providing a long-term home and a secure environment. Additionally, Respite Service is available for families or caregivers who need a break from providing full-time care to an individual with an Intellectual and developmental disability. Respite may be used for short or long periods of time from a few hours to several days. Respite Services may not always be available, and you should talk with Avita staff about any questions you have regarding Respite.
- **Employment Support** The Avita employment specialists can help individuals with Intellectual and development disabilities identify strengths, learn job skills, pursue interviews, and support them in succeeding at their job. Employment may only be a few hours per week up to full time employment. Our staff works with a variety of employers including banks, hospitals, food service operations, retail sites, manufacturing companies, and more.

Many families in our community are faced with the frightening uncertainty of not knowing where they will find their next meal. Fueled by a passion to ensure children don't go hungry over the weekends, our Backpack Love program reaches kids and their families where they are and when they need it most. Our hope is to distribute enough food each weekend to nourish every hungry family. Through volunteer teams and church partners backpacks are filled with enough food to feed a family of five for the weekend and are delivered to partner schools for distribution each week.

Services Provided:

Backpacks of food- Each Friday throughout the school year, we provide backpack full of food that feeds a food insecure family of five. Inside each bag are three dinners, two breakfasts, two lunches and snacks. Counselors at each school serve as the contact person and ensure that the backpacks are given to the students. In addition, counselors refer students to the program. Our food pantry is open all year to our community by appointment only.

Birthday Ministry- Many of our families that receive our backpacks are unable to provide a birthday for their children. Our organization steps in the gap and provides a sheet cake, plates, cups, forks, candles, juice, Bible and an age and gender specific gift.

Straight Street Camp- Straight Street recognizes that during the summer months the community needs daytime programs that offer a safe and nurturing environment for school age children to attend. Research confirms children not engaged in learning activities over the summer months will experience some loss of learning. This learning gap increases for disengaged youth from a low economic background. An effective summer program will aid in the growth and development of a young person and can enhance their educational pursuits. Straight Street provides a free summer camp for the children that receive our backpacks.

Children with Special Needs is a program for children from birth to age 21 with either developmental delays, chronic illnesses, or at high risk to develop medical or developmental disabilities. There are four programs underneath Children with Special Needs. Each program targets a specific age group and has services coordinated for this population.

Programs:

Babies Can't Wait

Babies Can't Wait is an early intervention program for children from birth to three years old. Babies Can't Wait provides services to the following counties: Banks, Dawson, Hall, Forsyth, Franklin, Habersham, Hart, Lumpkin, Rabun, Stephens, Towns, Union and White. The program serves children with disabilities or developmental delays and their families. Services include: Assistive technology, Audiology, Family training, counseling and home visits, Nutrition counseling, Occupational therapy, Physical therapy, Psychological services, Service coordination, Social work services, Special instruction, and Speech language therapy.

Children 1st

Children 1st serves as an assessment and referring agency for identifying newborns who have or are at risk for poor health and development. Children ages 0-21 that have established medical conditions or biological/ environmental risk factors are eligible for enrollment. An in-home assessment is completed by staff to identify any needs that the family may have. Children 1st links families with healthcare providers in the area, as well as offers referrals to other resources. This is a free program for all who choose to participate. There are no financial eligibility requirements.

Early Hearing Detection and Intervention

Newborn hearing screening is screening for hearing loss. All babies should be screened for hearing loss before 1 month of age. The screening is typically done before the baby leaves the birthing facility. EHDI includes screening for hearing loss in the birthing hospital; referral of those who do not pass the hospital screening for rescreening; for newborns who do not pass the rescreening referral for diagnostic audiological evaluation; and, linkage to appropriate intervention for those babies diagnosed with hearing loss. Technical assistance and training about implementing and maintaining a quality newborn hearing screening program is provided to hospitals, primary care physicians, audiologists, early interventionists, and public health staff

Eagle Ranch provides children and their families' much-needed support and guidance through our therapeutic residential program. We help families experiencing ongoing conflict resulting from a multitude of life events; death, divorce, absent parent, parental and/or marital issues, problems in communication, broken relationships, depression, anxiety, continued disrespect, defiance, trouble in school, outbursts and anger.

Description of Services:

Campus- A Christ-centered program we are located 45 minutes northeast of Atlanta in Chestnut Mountain, GA. The campus includes 6 boys' homes and 4 girls' homes, counseling center, athletic center, lake, an equine therapy program, and other extra-curricular resources.

Home Environment- Children stay on campus in one of our homes during the week and every other weekend to work on behaviors that have negatively impacted his/her family, school performance and personal growth. They go home every other weekend, holidays, and school vacations to give families an opportunity to put into practice the skills and knowledge gained during Ranch time. The average length of the program is 2 years.

Counseling- During a child's stay at Eagle Ranch, we provide their family ongoing support. Families come regularly for counseling sessions and to attend parent support meetings, while children in the program meet regularly with their counselor throughout their stay at the Ranch. Counselors work in partnership with Houseparents, Program Assistants, teachers *and* the child's family to ensure that the plan established for each child and his or her family is consistently followed.

Counseling at Eagle Ranch benefits the whole family, including siblings that may still be living at home, by providing:

- Individual, group and family counseling on an ongoing basis
- Monthly parent support groups to give the parents or primary guardian(s) of our children a network of support and accountability
- Quarterly educational events and insight nights to provide training to families
- Continued Care counseling to help families succeed after completing our program

Education- Children attend our private SACS accredited on-campus school.

Program Intake Requirements-

Child

- Applicants for the residential program need to be ages 8 15 at admission. Occasionally we have a few spaces for children who are in the 10^{th} and 11^{th} grades: please call and check our current availability.
- Average age of applicants is 11-14.
- Minimum IQ of 75.
- Mild to moderate emotional and/or behavioral problems.

• Grades 3-5 and 10-11 are served through a hybrid educational program that consists of an online curriculum and in-person teachers. Grades 6-9 are served face-to-face at Eagle Ranch School.

- No history of sexual offending behavior or sexual perpetration.
- No active suicidal or homicidal threats, ideation, or behavior (if history of suicidal or homicidal threats, ideation or behavior, a review of psychiatric/hospital records will determine appropriateness of placement at Eagle Ranch.)
- Average length of stay is 24 months.

Parent/Guardian

- Child's family must reside in the state of Georgia within 80 miles of the Eagle Ranch campus in Flowery Branch, GA.
- Family involvement with the goal of reunification. Must provide a home for child every other weekend, holidays and school breaks.
- Family must be willing to meet at the Ranch to participate in all counseling and parent-support group sessions.
- Child must have health insurance.
- Eagle Ranch works with many different family situations; however, we do require involvement in our program from key family members (e.g. parents with joint custody must both be involved).

Empowering Youth for Positive Change (EYPC)

The mission of Empowering Youth for Positive Change (EYPC) is to provide effective community-based mental health services to individuals who are experiencing significant behavioral and/or emotional challenges due to a documented mental health diagnosis.

Family Promise of Hall County (FPHC) utilizes a holistic approach to transform the lives of families experiencing homelessness.

Programs & Services:

- **The Homestead:** FPHC has a centralized campus off McEver Road called The Homestead from which we can provide a "home base" for families in the community seeking services. Our computer resource room and case management services are available to the community by appointment.
- **Empowerment Program:** FPHC helps low-income families achieve lasting independence by providing shelter and meals, amongst other support services (see requirements below). Through intensive case management and counseling, FPHC addresses the underlying causes of homelessness.
- Little Steps Community Daycare (LSCD): FPHC's state licensed child care facility offers both a free, temporary child care option and a permanent child care option with affordable rates for families referred to LSCD by a local partner agency. LSCD provides parents with quality child care while searching for employment, interviewing for jobs, awaiting eligibility for government mandated classes, etc.
- **Family Food Market:** FPHC's client-choice food pantry, available to Hall County residents, is open on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month, from 10am-12pm, alongside our Diaper Bank. Please bring ID.
- **Diaper Bank:** FPHC's Diaper Bank, available to Hall County residents, is open on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month, from 10am-12pm, alongside our Family Food Market. Diaper distribution is limited to two bundles per child per month based on supply.
- **L.I.F.E. Program:** The "Local Initiative for Family Empowerment" program provides free life-skills training workshops for residents of Hall County. Classes cover various topics such as financial literacy, parenting, healthy living, job skills, and career development. An example of these classes are our Lunch & Learn classes, offered on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month from 11:30am-1pm; lunch is provided.

Empowerment Program Requirements:

- 1. Must have children. We work exclusively with families with children. Any family or individual applying for our program must have at least one child in their custody.
- 2. Must be able and willing to work. We are a work-oriented program focused on families regaining independence by finding consistent, reliable employment.
- 3. Must not have a current situation involving domestic violence. Our facility is not equipped to handle situations with an imminent threat of domestic violence.
- 4. Must work or seek employment in Hall County. Children must be enrolled in local schools.
- 5. Must be willing to comply with our Guest Contract and Guidelines. We require that families comply with a basic code of conduct and meet specific expectations. For example, we do not tolerate drugs, alcohol, or violence. A drug screen will be required prior to entering the program.
- 6. Must pay a \$100 entry fee upon program entry. The fee will be prorated depending on the week of entry.

Larger venue events are sponsored several times a year to provide food, clothing, and other items to larger groups of people in need.

Services:

Meals- One of the primary material functions Feed the Need Ministry provides are good square meals for the homeless on Monday evenings at the Town View Coin Laundry in downtown Gainesville and at "the bridge" and at My Sister's Place on Thursday evenings. Meals typically consist of an entree, a salad, sides, a desert, and bottled water or soft drinks. Prior to saying grace and the beginning of the meal a short message is given.

Laundry- Every Monday at 7:00pm at Town View Coin Laundry in downtown Gainesville quarters are put in the washers and dryers for homeless who need their laundry washed.

Life Necessities- Distributing personal items such as clothing, toiletries, sleeping bags, tents and other items needed for basic survival. Emergency shelter – Gateway offers short-term housing for families fleeing abuse at home. Women and dependent children (boys and girls) up to age 18 may be admitted. The shelter is in a confidential location. Gateway can help find solutions for housing pets. Some longer-term transitional housing is available to families exiting the emergency shelter, but the inventory is limited.

Nonresidential services – Clients living in the community who have experienced domestic violence may come to Gateway for individual support, support groups and assistance accessing community resources. Some limited counseling appointments may be available.

Support groups for women – Support groups are available to women who live in the community or to those who live in one of Gateway's housing programs. Groups are free and are offered in English and Spanish. Meals and childcare are provided, and some transportation assistance may be available. <u>Women Seeking Change</u> – Psycho educational group that covers the basic dynamics of domestic violence. <u>Nurturing Parenting</u> – Parenting support groups for survivors of domestic violence. <u>Life Skills Training</u> – Teaches basic life sills (financial, transportation, stress management, etc.) for survivors of domestic violence. <u>Arts Support Group</u> – Arts-based support group teaches women strategies to manage stress and anxiety.

Children's programs – Early learning program activities are available for children ages birth – 3 years during women's groups. Support groups are offered for children and youth ages 4-6, 7-11 and 12-18. Limited slots for individual counseling are available.

Legal Advocacy / Temporary Protective Orders – Gateway employs legal advocates. These advocates help survivors of domestic violence apply for Temporary Protective Orders. Offices are located on the fourth floor of the Hall County Courthouse.

The Gainesville Regional office of the Georgia Legal Services Program serves the following counties (the counties in italics are also part of the elderly legal services grant: Barrow, *Banks, Cherokee*, Clarke, *Dawson*, Elbert, Fannin, *Forysth*, Franklin, Gilmer, Greene, *Habersham, Hall, Hart*, Jackson, *Lumpkin*, Madison, Morgan, Oconee, Oglethorpe, Pickens, *Rabun, Stephens, Towns, Union*, Walton, *White*. Georgia Legal Services represents clients in civil matters only. Some exceptions to the Case Acceptance Criteria can be made if a case is unusual or a widespread issue. A bilingual attorney is available to work with the Latino community. In addition, homebound and disabled clients can also be assisted.

General Types of Cases Handled:

- Temporary Protective Orders for family violence victims
- Public Benefits-Social Security, Food Stamps, Medicaid, Medicare, TANF, unemployment compensation
- Some divorce and custody cases
- Some corrections on birth certificates and some name changes
- Home ownership, foreclosure issues and problems in rental property
- Help with medical providers who are sending bills when Medicaid should have paid
- Advance Directives and wills for persons at least 60 years old or persons in hospice care
- Elderly abuse, financial abuse of the elderly
- Terminating or changing guardianships for elderly or disabled
- Nursing home discharges or denials
- School disciplinary issues

Eligibility Guidelines:

- Clients must be below 125% of the poverty guidelines set by the federal government (some deductions can be made, all perspective clients should check with Georgia Legal Services Program to determine eligibility).
- Clients must not have assets over set asset limit (all perspective clients should check with Georgia Legal Services Program to determine eligibility).
- Clients who live in the counties covered by the Elderly Legal Assistance Program who are at least 60 years old have no income limits or asset limits.
- Clients must be citizens of the United States or be documented in some way or be battered spouses/children or victims of trafficking. There are different types of immigration documents that will satisfy this requirement, check with Georgia Legal Services Program to see if a person or family qualifies. In addition, children who are U.S. citizens can sometimes be represented even if their parents are not.

Intake Procedures:

• Perspective clients can call every weekday between 9 and 5:00 pm and speak with an intake worker. The intake worker will determine case and financial eligibility. If criteria is met, the client is given an appointment with an attorney or paralegal. This appointment can be in the Gainesville office, a satellite office or by phone. Clients may be asked to fax documents prior to the appointment with an attorney or paralegal.

Good News Clinic provides non-emergency primary care including dental and medical care to Hall County residents ages 18-65 without private insurance, Medicaid or PeachCare. Individuals with Medicare or other insurance and without dental insurance can qualify for services at the dental clinic if income and residency requirements are met. Referrals are made for those who need specialized care. In addition, there are requirements that individuals and families must meet in order to receive care. Patients are seen by appt. only.

Requirements:

- Applicant must be a Hall County resident.
- Household income must be at or below 150% of the federal poverty level.
- Cannot have insurance or be eligible for Medicare, Medicaid or PeachCare.
- Individuals with Medicare or other insurance and without dental insurance can qualify for services at the dental clinic if income and residency requirements are met.

Application Process:

Application interviews are Monday-Thursday mornings at 8:30am-8:45 am- Individuals must come in person to apply and provide the following necessary documents. Application packet is online:

- Proof of Hall County residency (a bill showing name and address, etc.)
- Proof of household income (paycheck stub for last four pay periods, unemployment income letter, DFCS letter or certified letter from person providing assistance with living expenses)
- A picture ID

Services:

• Sam Poole Medical Clinic- provides primary healthcare services to people with multiple and complex medical problems that would otherwise, and repeatedly, end up in the emergency room. It is the principle focus of Good News Clinics to provide this large and still growing patient base with the continuity of care that is necessary to keep them out of the hospital.

New patients receive medical and laboratory screenings to identify any areas of concern. The information is then carefully reviewed by the medical staff to determine patient needs and choose appropriate physician volunteer for follow-up appointments.

- **Health Access-** Health Access provides specialty care referrals, diagnostic tests and treatment for uninsured patients referred by primary care providers (self referrals are not accepted), including the Northeast Georgia Physicians Group practice at the Hall County Health Department and Good News Clinics.
- **Green Warren Dental Clinic-** The Green Warren Dental Clinic provides acute dental care for adults including extractions and fillings. A prevention program is conducted for all new patients explaining proper brushing and flossing techniques, and nutrition for oral health. Following the class, each patient receives a dental exam including x-rays and an appointment with a dentist. Children are scheduled for sealant and fluoride treatments.
- **Good News Clinics Dispensary-** All patients who qualify are signed up for PAP (Patient Assistance Programs) assistance during their first appointment. Pharmaceutical samples are the source of many medications dispensed by the GNC dispensary.

• WeGo – Passengers can book a trip on a rideshare vehicle using the free WeGo Powered by Via app. Customers enter their pick-up and drop-off locations and a vehicle will pick them up within a block or two of their doorstep or a nearby location. Those who don't have a smartphone to download the app can book a ride by phone, call 770-503-3333, Option 1. Wait time is typically 15 minutes or less. After booking trips, riders need to start walking to the virtual bus stop, hence "Click - Walk - Ride". The WeGo service is offered between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. WeGo operates throughout Gainesville-Hall County. Customers can pay by credit card, debit card or a prepaid card, which is registered when they set up an account. Individuals may also purchase a voucher for a designated amount and use it to access the WeGo service. Trips 5 miles or less in distance cost \$2, plus 50 cents for each additional mile. All WeGo vehicles are equipped with a ramp and spaces for two wheelchairs. The WeGo app has special features for visually and hearing impaired persons.

The downtown summer trolley, which has the capability of transporting 24 passengers at one time, seeks out daytime passengers from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Monday-Friday, creating the opportunity to connect roughly 1,000 households to downtown Gainesville – home to some of the community's favorite eateries, retailers and craft beer/wine providers. Trolleys are estimated to complete a full lap every 30 minutes and will run for the duration of the service time, excluding City-observed holidays.

The Kinship Navigator Program serves as a one-stop shop for information and referral services to grandparents, relatives and other caregivers who are currently raising a child. The Kinship Navigator Program started more than 10 years ago as a state and county initiative to provide information, referral and follow-up to grandparents and other relatives raising children to link them to the benefits and services that they or the children need. The Georgia Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) has launched this program in direct response to the increasing number of grandparents and other caregivers who have assumed responsibility for raising another relatives' child(ren). As of 2013, 16 percent of all children in another's care are placed with kin. The Kinship Navigator Program is designed to support and assist relative caregivers, understanding the importance of keeping children within their family unit, when their biological parent cannot adequately provide for them.

Who does the Kinship Navigator Program serve?

A kinship caregiver serves as a short or long-term caregiver for relative child(ren). A kinship caregiver can be a grandparent, aunt, uncle, sibling or anyone who has established a 'kin-like' bond with the child(ren). The majority of kinship care arrangements are informal, private arrangements between parents and relative caregivers, while other situations arise as a result of involvement with the child welfare system. Kinship caregivers may also apply for child support services at no cost at their local Division of Child Support Services (DCSS) office or by completing an application for services online

Kinship Navigator Program scope

The Kinship Navigator Program is located statewide. The kinship navigators assist kinship families in identifying and locating resources within their local community. The program's overarching goal is to close the gaps and/or delays with service delivery to kinship caregivers. DHS focuses on providing a responsive strength-based supportive role to our kinship families.

Kinship Navigator Program goals

- Help caregivers understand and access programs and services available to them.
- Develop proactive ways to address caregiver needs and develop an informal and formal support system.
- Create a safe and supportive home environment for children outside of foster care, including assisting with family planning, early identification of needs for additional services such as therapy, counseling, educational and/or mental health services.

Whispering Angels Youth Ranch is a faith-based non-profit that is dedicated to providing hope, healing, love, and acceptance to young minds through the spirit and love of a horse, in a nurturing farm environment. The ranch facilitates healing to children that are facing challenging circumstances in their lives.

Requirements for Participation:

- Open to all children ages 8-18
- Willingness to participate
- Parents must remain at the facility for the duration of the session

• Cost is free to all participants

• New Orientation visit is required before sessions can begin

Ministries Offered:

*Chore time: Every child and leader pair will complete a small chore during session time. Chores at the Ranch are meant to teach the importance of serving others by giving through the work of your own hands and to also teach responsibility. Often this opportunity empowers children in knowing that their efforts can make a difference to those around them.

***Horse Time:** The majority of children who come to WAYR are drawn to the ranch because of the horses. During sessions children will first learn how to groom and care for their horse. After they have successfully learned how to care for their horse they will get the opportunity to learn to lead their horse and eventually will learn how to ride. All riding is done with an adult leading the horse. We do not offer horseback riding lessons.

***Devotion Time:** Children who attend the Ranch will likely be involved in group devotional time. During group devotion children and mentors may read the Bible together, read a book together, share about their day, share their struggles and pray together. Community is an important part of a person's walk with God as it opens up our hearts to God and others.

*Art, Woodshop or Garden Time: Whispering Angels has two fully stocked buildings specifically for arts and crafts; the art room and the woodshop. We also have a full summer and fall garden. Arts, crafts and time in the garden provide serenity in similar ways as the horses do. In our art room, child and mentor pairs can watercolor paint, acrylic paint, oil paint, throw pottery, make clay models and more. Child and mentor pairs can also spend time in our woodshop. Past woodshop projects have included making birdhouses, swords, chairs, cars and more.

***One-on-One Time**: Child and mentor pairs may also choose to spend some of their time on the swings, benches or in the grass chatting about life. Although our mentor volunteers are not certified counselors, they are prepared to talk about anything that the child would like to open up about. One-on-one time can be an important part of the child's time at the Ranch because many of the children we serve come from backgrounds of broken hearts and broken trust.

Sessions can include one or many of the above components, or even sometimes something entirely unique.

WorkSource partners with area universities, colleges, and private training providers to provide assistance with the cost of occupational skills training. The participant receives training in an in-demand field and local business is able to find the talent they need. This program is funded by the WorkSource Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) under the leadership of WorkSource Georgia Mountains (WSGM). Participants are not obligated to repay any funds received. WIOA funding works alongside other federal and state financial aid such as HOPE and Pell.

Training Assistance:

WIOA can assist with costs related to training expenses (books, tuition, tools, uniforms and shoes, certification, licensing, testing fees, etc.). It may also be able to help with transportation and childcare fees. Training can take place at colleges and universities, technical colleges, private education centers, and continuing education programs.

Work Training Program:

WorkSource Georgia Mountains has grant money to pay for short-term training for high-demand jobs. Eligibility requirements apply.

GED:

WIOA assists students attending GED programs. All GED services are free but individuals must meet eligibility requirements.

College/Technical College Assistance:

Eligible applicants pursuing college or technical college may receive assistance with the cost of books, tuition, and supplies needed to complete their educational programs. Approved programs should be completed within two (2) years or six (6) semesters. Assistance with transportation and childcare may also be provided.
